What challenges does adult education bring?

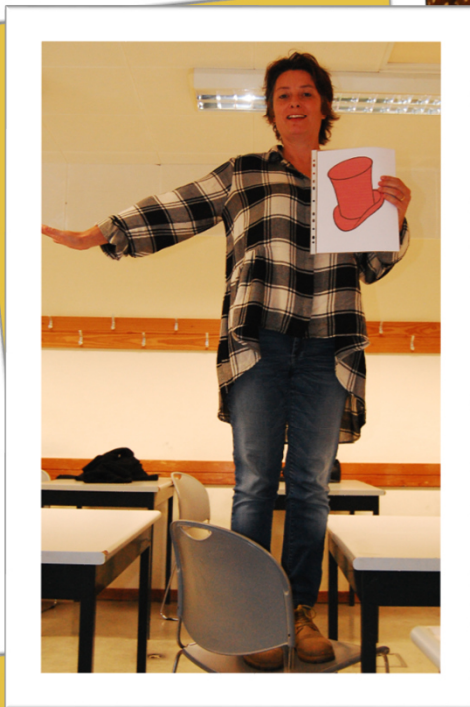
- *share more good experiences*
